Ball's playing was a decided feature. He made an unassisted triple play in the second inning and when he came to bat in the same inning, he hit for a home run to deep center. He had three more putouts than either the first baseman or catcher.

The second game was easy for Boston, errors by Bradley, Stovall and Perring allowing Boston to score seven runs in the second and third innings. Four runs were made in the third without the semblance of a hit.

Bisley Camp, July 19.—All the Canadians in the camp, including the men not on the official team, are competing in the Alexandra match, which opened today, at the 200 yards range. The competitors fire seven shots each at 200 and 600 yards. There are 321 prizes in this match, ranging down from £30 for first.

At the 200 yards range, Lieut. Neil Smith, of Chatham, Sgt. Richardson, of Victoria, and Sgt. Blackburn, of Winnipeg, unattached, all made possible.

Bayles' Great Win.

Bisley Camp, July 19.—Staff-Sgt. Bayles, who is with the Canadian team, though not officially attached, won the Wimbledon cup match, with a score of 43.

Staff-Sgt. Bayles is a member of the Royal Grenadiers, Toronto. By his shooting on Saturday he is entitled to the Wimbledon cup, or the classics of the Bisley prizes, or £125 in cash. He will probably take the cash. According to the official records of the Wimbledon cup, it has not been won by a Canadian since its institution, in 1865.

Bayles' 49 was out of a possible 50. The match was fired at the 500 yards range, ten shots for each competitor.

He tied three others, among them being Lieut. Mortimer, of Ottawa. In shooting off Bayles made 49, using the Ross rifle, made 47, which was counted out. No official member of the team competed in this match.
