

PARIS, March 30 .- A dispatch from Constantinople says that the ntire Armenian nation is faced with blindness, according to Dr. R. T. Uhls, head of the medical department of the Near East Relief.

This situation, he says, is due to the epidemic of trachoma raging throughout the country. Examination of 30,000 refugees revealed the fact that 27,000, or 90 per cent, were in the first stages of the disease. As at the beginning the disease is painless, both eyes are often deeply affected before its presence is known. disease has been known in the Caucasus for many generations, but the present epidemic is due to the lowered resistance of the populaion.
