RUSSIAN WARSHIPS

| Count Cassini denies that Russia was actuated by designs to possess Manchuria or Korea, by force of arms and says: Had kussia desired war, or even had she expected it, no considerations would have induced her to kyacuate Chinese territory and thus lose the opportunity of ending the war quickly."

Concerning the negotiations between Russia and Japan Count Cassini avers that his government "in the effort to bring the negotiations to a peaceful conclusion did all that dignity would permit, and offered to give assurances again that the sovereignty of the Emperor of China in Manchuria would be recognized. Having made this marked concession, solely in the interest of peace, my government waited the Japanese answer in the expectation that it would at least be diplomatic in character and would furnish the base for the furtherance of the negotiations to a satisfactory conclusion.

Before the Russian minister at Tokic could deliver this reply the Japanese answer came, not through the regular channels but as a torpedo attack at midnight. Thus, now that the war has come, Russia does not doubt the issue.
