Payment should be made to the grower of a certain amount and not less than 75 per cent of net returns. The fundamental principle of the association is based as follows: A. The care of the grower in production. B. The membership of all growers in the district. C. The contract from each grower for the fruit to be packed and graded. D. The establishment of a certain standard of pack from that certain district.

Marketing Medium. In British Columbia there are the following principal growing areas: Victoria and three adjoining districts, Hammond, Esquimalt, and Nanaimo; the Fraser valley, Salmon, Artn, Enderby, Armstrong, Vernon, Kelowna, Penticton, and the Okanagan valley; the Kootenay district and Grand Forks. SCALE OF SALARIES FOR LOCAL TEACHERS

New System Adopted By the School Board Last Night—Some Estimates
