It cannot be suggested that I have any sympathy with slanders. Particularly among the higher-ups and I have a strong prejudice against any eligible man who side-steps military service—and there are many thousands of them—but common sense compels me to admit that Mr. King was far more useful combating enemy propaganda by keeping back vital war supplies here than meeting up a minor staff job overseas. Many men in England who did far less service were highly rewarded with hereditary and other honors.
