GRAIN EXPORTS AT NEW YORK. Messrs. Goddall, Chapman and Secretary Will have returned from New York, where they, as a delegation from the Toronto Board of Trade, joined delegates from the Montreal Board of Trade in discussing with representatives of the trunk lines the question of inspection of Canadian grain for export.

Representatives of the New York Central, West Shore, Erie, Lehigh Valley, Delaware and Lackawanna and Pennsylvania railways were present.

Each of these railways had the same complaint, and as they had to keep open a large amount of stock in the same room they wanted to get the business in a more satisfactory state.

The railways had several meetings with the Board of Trade and United States Customs and had come to the conclusion that the only way to overcome the difficulty was to have Canadian grain inspected in New York under the rules of the New York Produce Exchange.

The Boards of Trade of Toronto and Montreal were both unanimous in objecting to such a proceeding, and their representatives stated these objections clearly but firmly before the trunk lines.

It was agreed that the best way would be to have the grain inspected before it was turned over to the trunk lines at the border.

The railways agreed to take the grain to the border and to have it inspected there.

The railways have appointed a bin room for 15 grades of grain for Ontario and 3 for Manitoba.

There are four for white, white, spring and green, one for peas, two for oats, one for rye and one for barley.

The railway men are to see if they can find a room for four more grades and apprise the boards of trade of the conclusions arrived at.

Our delegates say that the men are willing to make concessions as far as possible.
