NOTE AND COMMENT.

German scientists find that the application of the electric current to the soil increased the yield of grain and stalks in barley, 12 per cent., and with oats 43 per cent., while potatoes increased 24 per cent. and strawberries 50 per cent. In experiments made at Newcastle, Eng., a surplus of 37 per cent. was obtained with strawberries, a gain of 30.5 per cent. with peas, while the gain of potatoes was from 15 to 30 per cent. In another experiment the yield increased by 123 per cent. with straw-berries, with 32.5 per cent. with barley, by 119.5 per cent. with sugar beets and by 30 per cent. with beans. Sugar beets electrically grown yielded 2.2 to 2.7 per cent. more sugar than those grown without it, while tobacco electrically treated during growth is said to have a beautiful color and an excellent flavor.
