

Sir Robert Borden resisted firmly on Tuesday the importunities of 5000 farmers from Ontario, Quebec and New Bruns-wick, the largest delegation in the history of Ottawa, requesting modifications in The Military Service Act so as to allow exemption to farmers' sons.
