sessions to-day which you have so faithfully attended."

"There was first a lengthy discussion relative to sending out agents of the Alliance; then, various other items of business came up, and the Provincial Branch for Ontario was formed. Rose would not take the office of Treasurer. is one of the Executive Committee, however; and as for Secretaries, they have got two admirable ones, viz., Mr. Thomas Webster, Grand Scribe of the Sons of Temperance, and Mr. Casey, of the Casket, Grand Worthy Secretary of the Good Templars.
