The following information was obtained from the records of the Bureau of Prisons:

On June 10, 1968, the Bureau of Prisons received a letter from the Federal Bureau of Investigation, dated June 7, 1968, regarding the activities of the Black Panther Party.

The letter stated that the Black Panther Party had been identified as a subversive organization by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The letter also stated that the Black Panther Party had been found to be engaged in activities which were detrimental to the national defense.

The letter further stated that the Black Panther Party had been found to be engaged in activities which were in violation of the laws of the United States.

The letter concluded by stating that the Bureau of Prisons was requested to take appropriate action against the Black Panther Party.
