FIFTY-FOUR THOUSAND FEET RESERVED FOR CANADA.

First Royal Exhibition Commission Since 1862.

In order to give becoming significance to the event, a Royal Commission is issued for the holding of this Extinition, for the first time since 1802, and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has been appointed President to ther Majesty.

The very large space of stood square feet has been allotted to the Dominion of Canada by command of the President His Pread Highness.

This exhibition is to be purely Colonial and Indian, and no competition from the United Kingdom or from foreign nations will be permitted, the object being to exhibit to the world at large what the Colonies can do.

The grandest opportunity exer offered to Canada is thus afforded to show the distinguished place she occupies, by the progress she has made in Adrict Eurog, in the May Perriado Friendies, and Dissons, also in an adequate display of her vast resources in the Figuriars, and in Forest and Miskaal wealth, and also in Sintilyo

All Canadians of all parties and classes are invited to come forward and we with each other in endeavouring on this great occasion to put Canada in her true place as the primar colony of the British Empire, and to establish her proper position before the world.

Contract for Supply of Mail Bags.

CEALED TENDERS addressed to the Postmaster General (For Printing and Supply Branch), and marked "Tender for Mail Rag," will be received at Ottawa until 12 octock, noon on MONDAY, the 250 NOVEMBER, 1885, for the supply of the Post Office Department of Canada with such Cotton Duck, Jute and Leather Mail B.gs as may from time to time be required for the Postal Service of the Dominion.

Samples of the Bags to be furnished may be seen at the Post Offices at Hailfay, N.S., St. John, N.B., Charlottetoan, P.L.I., Quebe, Montreal, Ottawa, Tonotto, London, Winnipez, Main, Victoria, B.C., or at the Post Office Bejartment at Ottawa.

The Bags supplied, both as regards material and manufacture, to be fully equal to the samples, and to be delivered from time to time in such quantities as may be required at Ottawa.

The contract, if satisfactorily executed, shall continue in force for the term of four years, provided always the workmanship and material be satisfactory to the Postmaster General.

Each tender to state the price asked per hag in the form and manner prescribed by the form of tender, and to be accombanied by the written guarantee of two responsible parties, undertaking also to become bound with the contracted by the party tendering for the price demanded. Undertaking also to become bound with the contractor in the sum of two thousand dollars for the due performance of the contract.


