NOTES.

(a) There can be no doubt whatever that Kt to B 4 is Black's fine line of play. In fact, that move is one of the main pillars of the defense to the Ruy Lopez, when it assumes this or a cognate form.

(b) That the line intended by this and the next move should be his only resource, and I find no other, shows what a precious bad game he has.

(c) P to Q B 3 is probably his best. The text move lays the foundation for the fine combination that ensues.

(d) Q to R 4 follows the capture of the Kt with results but too obvious.

(e) Clearly intended when the last move was made. It will be seen also that the hand of brilliancy contains further picking.

(f) If Q to B 2, then, of course, Q to R 6 (h), etc.


