By Mr. Balcer,—Return to an Order of the House, dated February 17, 1960, (Question No. 185) showing: What were the travelling expenses for each Minister of the Crown for the fiscal years ending March 31, 1957, and March 31, 1959, and to which votes were these expenses charged in each particular case?

By Mr. Balcer,—Return to an Order of the House, dated March 9, 1960, (*Question No. 192*) showing: 1. Has the government ordered and received aircraft designated as the CF-100?

- 2. If so, when was the first delivery received and what has been the delivery figures by month since then?
- 3. Has any of these delivered aircraft entered squadron service since the first delivery?
- 4. If so, what has been the figure put into such service month by month, since the first deliveries?
- 5. What is the figure, month by month, of CF-100's taken permanently out of squadron service?
- 6. How many CF-100's are now in storage and have not been in squadron service?

By Mr. Monteith (Perth), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council,—Copy of Amending Agreement No. 9, dated February 15, 1960, respecting contributions under the Hospital Insurance and Diagnostic Services Act, between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Province of Manitoba.
