Your letter of the 16th instant is before me.


The Succession Duties demanded by the Province of Quebec on the estate of Mrs. Eddy have been so large that we are compelled to avail ourselves of the provisions of the Will which permit the Executors to pay the \$200,000.00 within five years, without interest.

I am very hopeful that we may be able to make a substantial payment within the next six months, but as to that I am not certain. Mr. Sherriff and I are hoping that by the end of the year we will be able to determine exactly what we may be able to do to pay you the <sup>whole plus</sup> \$200,000.00.

When I am next in the East I will communicate with you in any event.

I may add that the dividends on part of the estate have been cut in two since the death of Mrs. Eddy, and Mr. Sherriff and I find ourselves placed in a somewhat more difficult position than we had anticipated, by reason of the demands of the Province of Quebec.
