

LAKE MEMPHREMAGOG.

IN the great basin that lies between the White and Green Mountains, and on the borders of Vermont and Canada, is Lake Memphremagog, one of the loveliest inland lakes within the limits of New England. Its name is of Indian origin, and signifies Beautiful Water. Though differing in many particulars, in general appearance it more nearly resembles the far-famed Lake George than any other body of water that has come under our observation, and is so regarded by old travelers who are familiar with both. There are no marshes along its borders, and its shores are rock-bound, while the water is cold and clear as crystal.
