Chamaecyparis sphaeroides.

Family . . CONIFERÆ, Pine.
Foliage . . Brown-green, triangular awl-shaped
tiny scales.
Cone . . . Tiny, with about 6 scales opening
from axis of cone, beneath branch.
Bark . . . Fibrous, dull brown.
Height . . . 30 ft. to 90 ft.
Habitat . . . Me. through Atlantic States to Fla.
and Miss.

Arbor Vitæ, White Cedar.
Thuja occidentalis.

Family . . CONIFERÆ, Pine.
Foliage . . Flat, in scales, clear green, spreading.
Cone . . . Tiny, with about 6 to 10 scales, light
brown, scales opening from base
of cone.
Bark . . . Fibrous, dull gray-brown.
Height . . . 20 ft. to 50 ft.
Habitat . . N. H. and N. Y. along Alleghany
Mts. to North Car., west to Minn.

Red Cedar.
Juniperus Virginiana.

Family . . CONIFERÆ, Pine.
Foliage . . Ruddy brown-green; young trees,
sharp needles; old trees, tiny scales.
Fruit . . . A cadet-blue berry, beneath bloom,
purple-black.
Bark . . . Fibrous, brown, shreddy. Heart-
wood red and aromatic.
Height . . . 30 ft. to 90 ft.
Habitat . . Common; Me. to Minn., south to Fla.
