HAT at the inftance and requeft of William Taylor his brother, Merchant of the fame place, who confidered himfelf agrieved, as appears by the annexed challenge or exception of the Honorable Judges John Frafer, Efg: and Hertel de Rouville, Efg: Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the Diffrict of Montreal, your Memorialist went to the dwellings of the faid Judges and ferved them with notice as appears likewife by the oath of Angus M'Donald thereat; for this Act he is under fentence by the fame Judges of one callendar month's confinement, as appears by the annexed copy thereof certified by the failer George Young no other being allowed as appears by the oath of Angus M'Donald annexed likewife; that in confequence of the faid fentence your Memorialist is confined in the common prifon amongst the criminals in an horid noxicus and unhealthful fituation by which his life may be in great danger and his interefts of great importance to him and those of his helples brother by the loss of fight and in an ill state of health fuffers great injury, by your Memorialifts being deprived of is liberty; and the comfort of visitation by his filends except fuch as condefiend to the trouble
