BETTER SERVICE ON C.P.R. LINES

Lindsay and Port McNicoll Will Be Connected and Hamilton-Guelph Junction Service Improved.

Two new train services will be instituted on Monday by the Canadian Pacific. Lindsay and Port McNicoll will be connected by a train which will leave Lindsay for the north daily except on Sunday at 10:45 a.m., arriving at Lindsay 12:30 p.m. and at Port McNicoll 1:40 p.m. Returning, the new train will leave Port McNicoll at 8:30 p.m., arriving in Lindsay at 6:15 p.m. Commencing from July 1st the following schedule will be run between Hamilton and Guelph Junction. Eastward trains will leave Hamilton at 5:35 a.m., 7:50 p.m., 8:30 p.m., and 1:50 p.m., arriving at Guelph Junction at 8:15 a.m., 3:35 p.m., 6:10 p.m., and 11:10 p.m., respectively. Westward trains will leave Guelph Junction at 7:10 a.m., 10:10 a.m., 2:25 p.m., 5:15 p.m., and 8:10 p.m., arriving in Hamilton at 8 and 11 in the morning, at 3:15, 6:05, and 9 p.m.

The institution of this new schedule will give connection at Hamilton with practically all thru trains. If indications so far can be trusted the capacity of the railways will be taxed to the limit on Monday next. The trains for the north carried extra coaches yesterday and the rush will be greater to-day if the fine weather continues. The trains for Montreal were also lengthened to accommodate the holiday throng.

CITY TO APPEAL BOARD OF TRADE LEVEL TRACK DECISION HONORS TWO OFFICERS

Will Ask High Court to Refute Railway Board's Judgment re Metropolitan Railway on Grounds of Illegality — Police on the Watch and Will Stop Any Work.

After a conference with Corporation Counsel Drayton, yesterday morning Acting Mayor Church stated that the city would appeal the Ontario Railway Board's recent decision which permitted the Metropolitan Railway to run their cars on the level over their right of way within the city limits. At the present time Mr. Drayton is conferring with the property holders affected who have already agreed to assist the city in its appeal. In the meantime the police have been instructed to report any attempt which the company may make to lay their tracks. Mr. Drayton will report to the board of control not later than Wednesday regarding the progress he has made in determining the city's case for an appeal. In the meantime it is said that the property holders in the vicinity of the tracks will hold a meeting to discuss the situation. Many of the residents adjacent to the proposed tracks have engaged their own solicitors who are working in conjunction with Mr. Drayton, to secure justice for their clients. The appeal will be made to the high court.

According to Corporation Counsel Church, the board based its decision in ultra vires. Again he claims that the municipality's consent was never given to the level crossings, although the general act requires it and the act has been upheld by the Dominion Parliament. The railway, he claims, have no charter rights to run on the level over their right of way. The fact that no provision was made to compensate the propertyholders and the summary manner in which the decision was given, he claims, has strengthened the city's appeal. To succeed in their appeal the city must convince the high court that the section of the act upon which the board based their decision was illegal, and that the city can uphold their contention to this effect.

Handsome Cabinets of Silver Presented to R. S. Gourlay and John F. Ellis, Accompanied By Addresses Expressing Appreciation of Work Done For the Board.

The board of trade committee of one hundred, at their luncheon at McCone's yesterday, relinquished for the day their efforts for betterment along civic lines to indulge in a little social festivity, which took the form of presentations of cabinets of silver to President R. S. Gourlay and John F. Ellis, who for thirty years have been actively associated with the board on the executive and latterly as treasurer. G. T. Somers, president of the board, paid tribute to the faithful work of Messrs. Gourlay and Ellis in the past, and referred to them as having been the "backbone" of the board, at times when the board's finances and general outlook was not nearly as rosy as it is at the present time.

Mr. George read the presentation address to Mr. Ellis, which referred to Mr. Ellis' success in placing the board upon a sound financial footing. "Many are the evidences of your careful stewardship," read the address. "We confidently expect that you will continue with us for many years to watch the advancement and growth of this trade and to receive evidence of the respect and affection in which you are held by your countless friends."

Mr. Ellis, in reply, thanked the members for their appreciation of his services, stating he had always been a worker and deal with which the board of trade organization. He felt that the board and himself were twin the same year.

Best Year in History. The address to Mr. Gourlay, read by J. D. Allan, commended him on the ability, energy and deal with which he had steered the course of the board during his presidency. "We all admit that this year has been the best in the history of the Toronto Board of Trade. In the main success was due to the R. S. Gourlay, the chief executive officer."

Many Benefits. Mr. Gourlay in reply summed up the benefits which had accrued to him thru his association with the board, pointing out how much greater these were than the time and energy he had put into his work. He did not think he was entitled to the credit which the address credited him. "Last year was a year of opportunities, due to the efforts of past presidents. Myself and my executive merely took advantage of these opportunities, and we made the most of them."

In conclusion Mr. Somers pointed out that the recipients of the presentation would be interested in knowing that the entire outfit, with the exception of the silk which lined the cabinet, were produced in Canada and finished by Canadian workmanship.
