WERE THEY HYPONOTIZED?

A Remarkable Scene in New York on Sunday.

CARNEGIE HALL CROWDED

With People Who Gave Their Diamonds and Jewelry for Missions.

Rev. A. B. Simpson's Simple Pledge Set the Gathering Into Intense Religious Fervor.

Others Gave Fifty, One Man Gave \$50,000 Worth of Stock.

Other Gave Fifty—The Total Found on the Missionary Plates Was About \$110,000—Mr. Simpson Formerly of Hamilton.

New York, Oct. 12.—Outbursts of intense religious fervor marked the missionary meeting in Carnegie Hall yesterday morning. Hundreds of persons contributed \$110,000 in jewelry, securities and cash to carry on the work of spreading the gospel.

It was the occasion of the sermon and offering in connection with the Christian Missionary Alliance, the climax of two weeks of meetings. Men gave their watches, women their rings, children their pennies under the magic spell of simple sentences uttered by the Rev. Dr. Simpson.

The hall was filled. There were some even in the topmost galleries. As at all such gatherings, the women were present in the greater numbers. They sat in the front rows of the main floor hardly a man was to be seen.

The Rev. A. B. Simpson, president and founder of the Alliance, delivered the missionary sermon. It was a simple address, describing the missionary endeavors of Philip, Peter, Paul and Barnabas. The point that he impressed on the audience was that the missionary was not a hero. He simply was paying his debts to God.

The Rev. Dr. Simpson warned to his subject and his powerful voice filled the hall to its furthestmost cranial, as, pointing to a large map of the world, he exclaimed tragically: "Yonder 200,000 baby girls thrown to the dogs. Yonder, in Africa, 10,000,000 dying every year in the slave trade. Yonder, mothers daring not to wean their children, dugged to death before their eyes. There in Spain, scores of insane from seeking in vain for salvation."

"You cannot go to your graves, Others have a thousand million dying men, in the name of Calvary, I hand you the bill from the Master's hand. How much will you give?"

USHERS PASSED ALONG. Ushers passed through the audience distributing pledge cards. On one side, the offering showing that it cost \$300 to support a missionary in Africa or China, \$250 in India, \$100 for a native preacher, \$35 for a native female worker, \$25 for a boy.

A Fine Strike Just Made on the Big Three.

MASCOT SHOWS GOOD ORE.

It Was the Eldorado Property Deeded Over by Rufus Pope.

Leaving the Company's Property Unimpaired—Trail Creek Smelter Will Handle Slocan Silver in Connection With Rossland Ore—American Owners Object to U. S. Government Sampling Works at Northport—Confidence Continues to Increase.

Rossland, B. C., Oct. 12.—(Special.)—The World, via Spokane, Wash.—Petitions to the United States Government are in circulation among the American mining men here against the establishment of a Government sampling works at Northport. This, it is said, would work a hardship for mine owners, there being only one outlet.

It is understood that the Trail Creek smelter will handle Slocan silver ores in conjunction with Rossland ore, as the treatment will cost less.

The Big Three Company, working on Mascot, which covered Eldorado ground, but was deeded to the Big Three Company by Rufus Pope, leaving the company's property unimpaired, struck a vein of \$55 one two feet wide at a depth of 20 feet.
