GROW BY SUFFERING

Hopes Superannuation Fund Will Reach Total of Two Millions.

"We can't have our own lives enlarged simply by admiring the heroism of our Canadian men who have risen to the challenge of sacrifice in this war," declared Rev. S. D. Chown, D. D., superintendent of the Methodist Church of Canada, preaching at the morning service yesterday in the First Methodist Church on the subject of the enlargement of life through suffering. "Pacificism can't make character." he continued, adding, "I heard a speaker at Chautauqua say that if a German army should land in the United States, the best way to meet it would be to give it a good, old-fashioned New England dinner. No doubt the German army would eat the dinner, then proceed to eat up the people, too. Bolsheviki pacificism cannot arrest the Germans in Russia. The United States tried these methods for nearly three years and wasted a great deal of note paper, until the United States found that it was losing its own soul and that it was losing its own soul and that it would profit the nation nothing if it gained the whole world and lost its own soul. Then it was that the United States rose to the test and subscribed more money than had been required of it in all the years of its history, and raised an army to co-operate with God in the destroying of war, and to develop a character that would need no purifying fires of war.

"The best cure for trouble is to grow larger than trouble. This, indeed, is the only cure of which I know, to have the foundation of character so rooted in God that trouble cannot harm, but only make greater. We cannot live lives worthy of our time unless we are enlarged. I fear if we grow smaller, we will run down to nothingness and uselessness.
