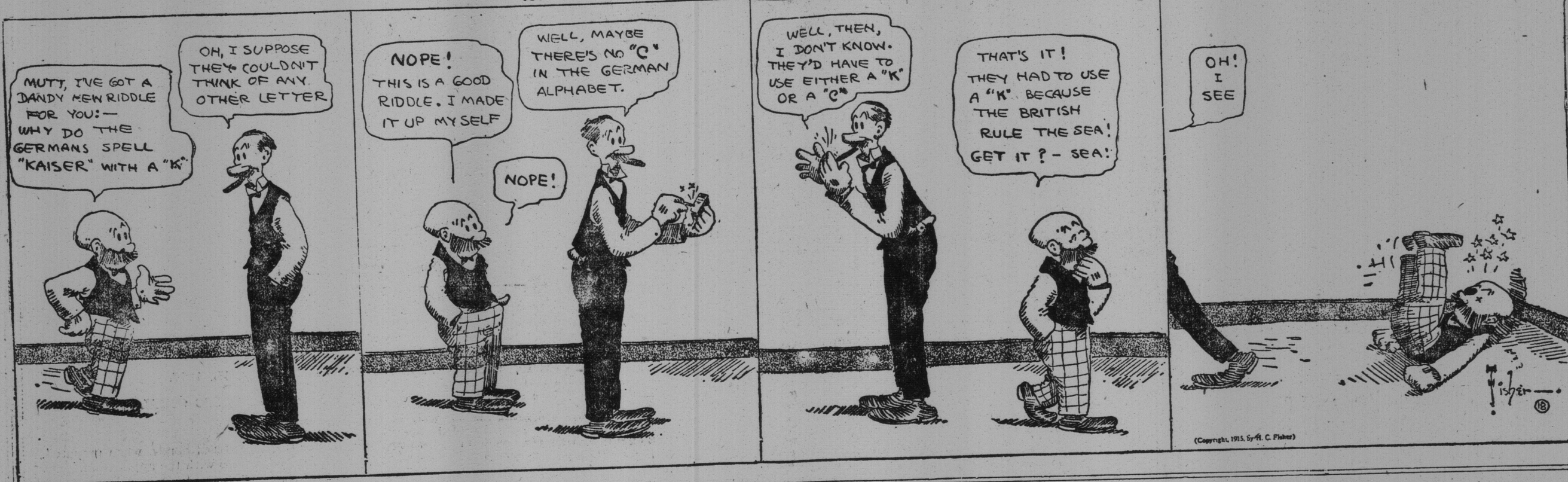

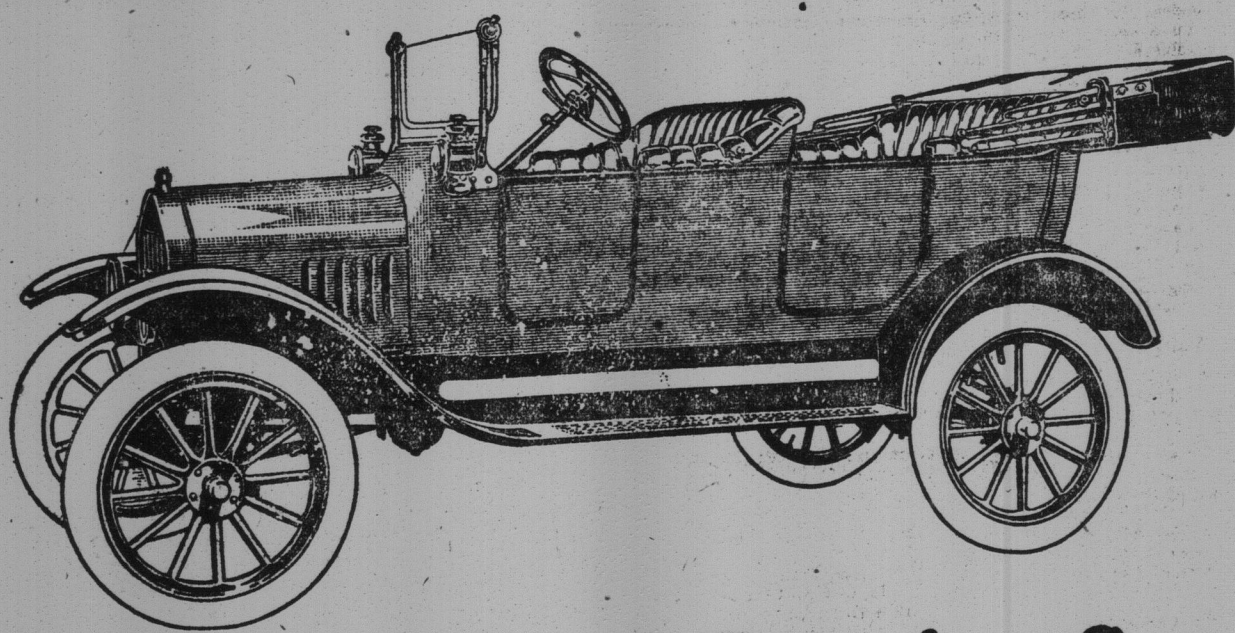
Claims Postal Surplus

Ottawa, Sept. 19.—The post office department announces a surplus of \$2,849,471 for the last fiscal year. Revenue for the year was \$18,600,000, and the expenditure \$15,750,529. Revenue for the year increased by \$5,511,760 as compared with 1914-15, while the cost of the postal service increased by only \$4,549,471.
