

## FORMER OFFICER OF FREDERICTON IS FINED \$50

**A. Ford Yerxa Pleads Guilty to Liquor Offence—Richard O'Leary Appointed Member of Vocational Board—Government Meeting.**

Fredricton, Aug. 3.—A. Ford Yerxa, patrolman on the Fredericton police force until his resignation was sent on Tuesday, the result of his being found at a resort in Kingsclear during a search by Chief of Police Finley and Sub-Inspector Fraser. Yerxa, through his counsel acknowledged an offence under the prohibition act in the police court this afternoon. He was convicted and fined \$50.

## U. S. GUARDS THE HEALTH OF THE IMMIGRANTS

## WORKS TO RESUME; MEN ACCEPT LOWER WAGES

London, Aug. 4.—(By Canadian Associated Press).—Calling from Adelaide, Australia, a correspondent says that resumption of work at the Great South Australian smelting works at Port Pirie will proceed immediately. The works have been closed since a disastrous fire of some months ago. The 600 employees immediately affected have agreed to accept lower wages in preference to the alternative of longer hours for the same wage.

## BELIEVE IRISH PEACE ASSURED

Demobilization of Republican Army Taken as Good Sign; Secret Understanding Suspected.

(Canadian Press Despatch). London, Aug. 3.—The Irish republican army has virtually been demobilized, and other leaders. This was considered a further indication that peace terms between the Sinn Fein and the British government have been practically agreed upon in secret, and that only a formal announcement remains to be made. It is said that the Sinn Fein will approve any terms satisfactory to President De Valera and other leaders.

## CUTS CANDY PRICES A THIRD

New York, Aug. 4.—A reduction of 33-1/3 per cent in candy prices was announced yesterday by one of the largest candy firms in the city. The president of the George W. Loft Company declared that the firm had no connection with action taken by other firms but was merely carrying out of a policy of "meeting the market on normal business standards."
