Q-110 Had you been given detention at the trial?

A- Yes, sir.

Q-111 You absented yourself when in detention and, in the second place, absented yourself when in lawful custody under escort, is that right?

A- Yes, sir.

Q-112 You managed to get out of custody on various occasions. Don't you remember how you did it?

A- I don't. Sir, I get in the state of mind, I get worried and I just, all I know I want to get away, and everything is in a blur to me.
