Supreme Court Confirms the Decision-

NEW YORK, June 4 — Harry K. Thaw must remain in the state asylum for the criminal insane at Mattealum for the criminal insane at Matteawan under a decision rendered today by the appellate division of the supreme court in Brooklyn.

Thaw's application for a writ of habeas corpus releasing him from the asylum was dismissed by a justice of the supreme court several months ago. He then appealed to the appellate division which today sustained the lower court and dismissed the writ.
