

Toronto, July 16—Brigadier General and Honorable Senator Jas. Mason president of the Home bank, honor ary treasurer of the Canadian Red Cross, died this afternoon following

Cross, died this afternoon following an operation.
General Mason was one of Canada's best known bankers and militia men. He served in the suppression of the Fenian raids and Northwest rebellion. In the latter he and his company were the first to cross the Saskatchewan at the Fish Creek engagement, charging the rebels after every attempt to dislodge them had failed. He was severely wounded at the Battle of Batoche.

He was born in Toronto, in 1843, of Irish parentage. He was a Roman Catholic and a Conservative.


