The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass. Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Senate, and desire their concurrence.

Mr. Speaker acquainted the House, That a Message had been brought from the Senate by their Clerk, as followeth :-

The Senate have passed the following Bills without any amendment:

Bill intituled : "An Act to amend 'The Steamboat Inspection Act, 1882,' by re-" ducing the fees payable on renewal of Engineers' Licenses."

Bill intituled : "An Act respecting the Independence of Parliament Act, 1878, " forty-first Victoria, chapter five."

Also, the Senate have agreed to the Amendment made by this House to the Bill. intituled : "An Act further to amend the Act thirty-first Victoria, chapter twelve, " intituled : 'An Act respecting the Public Works of Canada,' " without any amendment.

Also, the Senate have passed the Bill, intituled: "An Act further to amend "'The General Inspection Act, 1874,'" with several Amendments, to which they desire the concurrence of this House.

And also, the Senate have passed the Bill, intituled: "An Act to amend and con-" solidate, as amended, the several Acts respecting the Adulteration of Food and " Drugs," with several Amendments, to which they desire the concurrence of this House.

A Bill from the Senate, intituled: "An Act to amend 'The Dominion Lands " ' Act, 1883," was, according to Order, read the third time. Resolved, That the Bill, with the Amendments, do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Senate, and acquaint their Honours. That this House hath passed the same with several Amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read, for the second reading of the Bill from the Senate, intituled : "An Act to extend the limitation of time under the Act forty-" third Victoria, chapter seven, intituled : 'An Act for the final settlement of claims "' to lands in Manitoba by occupancy, under the Act thirty-third Victoria, chapter " ' three ' ";

The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and committed to a Committee of the Whole House.

Resolved. That this House do immediately resolve itself into the said Committee. The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee, and, after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Girouard reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and directed him to report the same without any amendment.

Ordered, That the Bill be now read the third time. The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Senate and acquaint their Honours, That this House hath passed the same without any amendment.

The Order of the Day being read, for the third reading of the Bill to authorize certain subsidies and grants for and in respect of the construction of the lines of **Railway** therein mentioned;

On motion of Sir Charles Tupper, seconded by Sir Leonard Tilley,

Ordered, That the said Order be discharged.

Ordered, That the Bill be now re-committed to a Committee of the Whole House, for further consideration.
