HOPE, Hon. ADAM. (*Hamilton.*)

The family came originally from Holland, with William, Prince of Orange, at the Revolution of 1688, consisting of two brothers, commissioned officers in the army, and subsequently farmers near Edinburgh, leaving a son, Alexander Hope, who left two sons, Alexander and James. The latter married Janet, daughter of Robert Adamson, merchant, Dunkeld, and had two sons, Robert and William. Robert became tenant of East Ferrygate, East Lothian, in 1774, and subsequently of the neighbouring farms of West Fenton, and Fenton Barns, and was succeeded by Robert Hope, Esq., the father, and George Hope, Esq., the brother of Senator Hope, both distinguished as eminent agriculturists and writers on agricultural affairs. B. at West Fenton, Parish of Dirleton, East Lothian, Scotland, 8 January 1813. Ed. at Dirleton Parish School and in Edinburgh. Was six years in the counting house of a Leith firm, in which David Davidson, Esq., formerly treasurer of the Bank of Scotland, and General Manager of the Bank of Montreal, was then a partner. Emigrated to U.C. in 1834, and entered the office of Young, Weir, & Co., merchants, Hamilton; began business in St. Thomas in 1837, and served as a private in a volunteer company in the Rebellion of that year. M., in 1840, Hannah, dau. of Thomas White, Esq. Removed to London in 1845, and subsequently to Hamilton in 1865, where, as in London, he had been largely engaged in mercantile business. Is President of the Hamilton Provident and Loan Society, and a Director of the Canadian Bank of Commerce. Was called to the Senate, 3 January 1877. Is strongly in favour of the system of British Parliamentary Party Government for Canada, with party lines sharply drawn. A Liberal, and in favour of Free Trade, as understood in England.—*Hamilton, Ont.*
