Eld. s. of the late Mr. James Stirton, one of the earliest settlers at Guelph. B. in Forfarshire, Scot., 1816. Has been a Magistrate for the past twenty years. Was Reeve of Tp. of Puslinch for some years. Is a Captain in the Militia. Sat for South Wellington in L. A., Can., from g. e., 1857, until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g. e. A Liberal, and opposed to the present Govt.—*Guelph, Ont.*

STREET, Lieut.-Col. THOMAS CLARKE, J.P. [*Welland.*]

S. of the late Hon. Samuel Street, of Niagara Falls. B. there. Unmarried. Called to the Bar, U.C., in Easter Term, 1838. Is President of the Suspension Bridge Co.; a Trustee of the University of Trinity College, Toronto; a Director of the British America Assurance Co., and of the Canadian Bank of Commerce; and Lieut.-Col. commanding 1st Batt. Welland Militia. Was President of the Gore Bank, and of the Agricultural Association of Upper Canada, and a Director of the late Bank of Upper Canada. Sat for Welland in L.A., Can., from g. e., 1851, until g. e., 1854, when defeated; and again from g. e., 1861, until the Union. Returned to Commons by acclamation at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir J. A. Macdonald.—*Chippawa, Ont.; Rideau Club.*
