An Act to vest certain Real Estate of the late John Knatchbull Roche, in the hands of Trustees.

WHEREAS the Widow of the late John Knatchard Roche, in his Preamble. lifetime of the Town of Port Hope, in the County of Durham, in this Province, Esquire, Provincial Land Surveyor, doseased, hath by her Petition represented that the said John Knatelebell Reche died on 5 the thirteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; that the said John Zazzehbull Roche died intestate, leaving Annie Mary Elizabeth, William Hardy. and Frederick George, his lawful children, the said Annie Mary Elizabeth being an infant of the age of seven years, the said William Hardy 10 being an infant of the age of four years, and the said Resterick George being an infant of the age of two years, and that the said Annie Mary Elizabeth, William Hardy, and Frederick George, reside in Port Hope aforesaid with said Petitioner; that during the litering of the said John Knatchbull Roche, he entered into a contract with the University 15 College for the purchase of Lot number one, cast of More street and south of Ward street, and Lot number one, west of Eleia street, south of Ward street, in the said Town of Port Hope, which there is now due to the University the sum of two hundred and seventy-one pounds : That the said John Knatchbull Boche also purchased Town 20 Lot number sixty-two, in the said Town of Port Hope, spon which he granted a mortgage, on which mortgage there is now the the sum of two hundred and seventy-one pounds : That the said John Knatchbull Roche died, seized in fee of Park Lot number seven, part of Lot number fourteen, in the twelfth concession of the Township of North 25 Monaghan, containing nine acres; And whereas the said petitioner has represented that the whole of the said property is approductive, and that the said petitioner derives no revenue for the support of her family from any part of the said estate; And whereas, in consequence of the death of the said John Knatchbull Roche and the minority of his three 30 children, and their consequent legal incapacity to excepte conveyances. the contracts made by the said John Knatchbull Boele in his lifetime for a sale of a portion of the said real estate cannot at the present be legally or advantageously made, nor can any revenue be derived for the support of his said childron; And whereas the said petitioner hath 35 prayed that an Act may be passed to vest the said above-mentioned real estate of the said John Knatchbull Roche in the kards of Trustees, with power to sell and dispose of the same for the purposes and objects above mentioned, namely, to enable them in the first place to pay off all incumbrances thereon, and to invest the balance of the proceeds 40 arising from such sale for the benefit of the children of the said John

40 arising from such sale for the benefit of the children of the said John Knatchbull Roche, according to their several and respective shares in his inheritance, and it is expedient to grant the proper of the said petitioner as hereinafter mentioned; Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of 45 Canada, enacts as follows:
