

# Co-ed cans now a reality

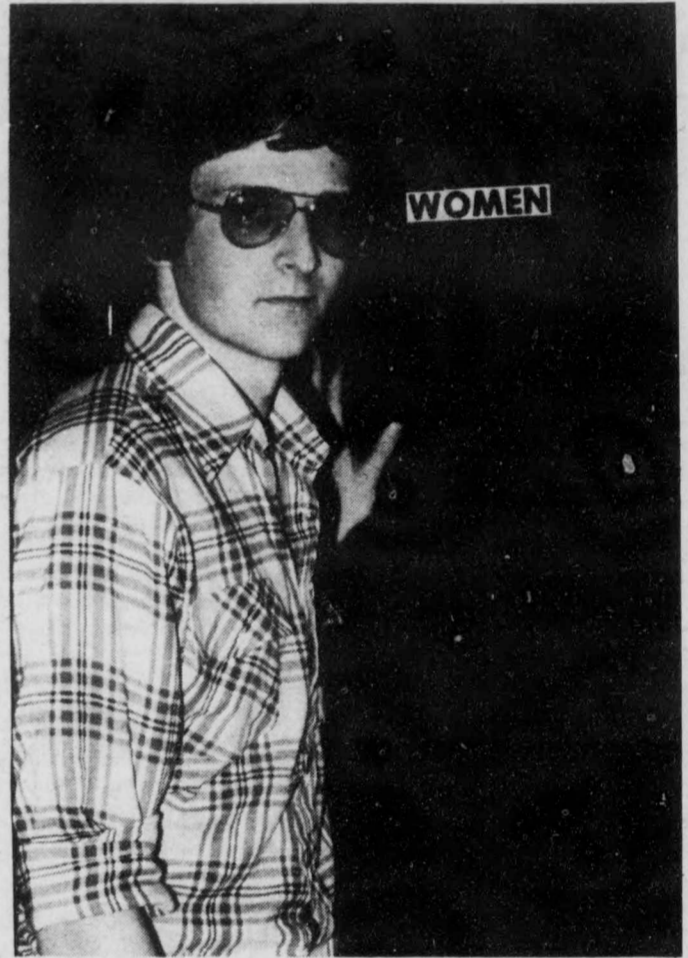

Washbottom said the CCC has been criticizing segregated washrooms as the final barrier to true sexual equality. "Why should I walk all the way down the hall to go to the can when there's a ladies one right outside the cafeteria door?" he asked.

Washbottom also said that separate washrooms lead to more vandalism simply because they are limited to one sex. "People won't be forced to draw unusual pictures or write risque poetry on the walls as an enactment of their fantasies. Since both sexes will be frequenting the room, all fantasies will be close at hand," he said.

Some walls may be knocked down to create a more airy atmosphere, as part of the washroom redecoration plan, a study done by ten students last summer. 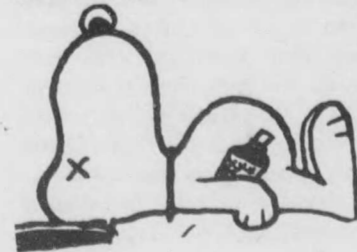
Cries of "its God's will" and "Let's call a spade a shovel" were echoed throughout the meeting.
