

Ottawa, 10th January 1924

My Sir, -

With further reference to the correspondence in connection with the fence repair on the Rocky Point Indian reserve, I have to request you to make an estimate of what you consider it ould be necessary to expend in order to repair this fence. In making this estimate for such portions of the fence as it will be necessary to completely reduced, your estimate should give (a) the cost of repairing the fence as previously constructed (b) the cost of repair, provided the form of fence which is usually considered a standard fence in that district is erected.

It has been stated that the previous fence had a small gate opening on to the land of the Charlottetown Summer Resorts Limited and they request that no gate be placed when the fence is renewed. This request would appear to be a reasonable one and I would ask you to inform the Department if there is not proper egress on to a public thoroughfare at some other point which would obviate the necessity of the small gate being renewed where it previously existed.
