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thick ledge was safely past and above
 after climbing through a large snow
 patch I found myself on the very high
 top peak of all. From there I had
 the greatest and most impressive
 view I had ever seen, for I seemed to
 be up in the clouds almost and all
 around me were hundreds of snow
 clad peaks, east, west, north and
 south, everywhere they the eye. On
 one side rose the mighty jagged peaks
 away amongst the mountains of the
 Fennoscandian on the other the
 round white summits of the Alps
 toward the west amongst the
 Swiss Alps. Below me was Lake Geneva
 which I could see from end to end, and
 many a valley and little village. My
 head seemed almost to swim and my

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
