ORDER IN COUNCIL ON HEREDITARY TITLES.

Sir ROBERT BORDEN: By the leave of the House I should like to lay upon the table a copy of the Order in Council of 25th of March last respecting titles. It has already been read to the House, but it has never been formally laid upon the Table.

HEREDITARY TITLES IN CANADA

On motion of Sir Robert Borden, the House proceeded to Public Bills and Orders for the purpose of resuming the adjourned debate with respect to the resolution of the hon, member for Kingston (Mr. Nickle) respecting titles (resumed from April 8, 1918).

Right Hon. Sir ROBERT BORDEN (Prime Minister): When this motion was last under consideration on the 8th of April, the hon. member from Springfield (Mr. Richardson) moved the following amendment:

That the word "hereditary" be struck out from the Resolution, and that the third para-graph thereof conclude with the word "Canada" in the ensuing line.

And then, as explained by the hon. ber for Springfield on that occasion, the result of that amendment, if carried, would be that the motion would read:

We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Commons of Canada in
