c. Carrying out training and testing with operational air squadrons under conditions of extreme cold in Canada.

The Canadian members invited the attention of United States members to cold weather tests at Edmonton of RCAF and RAF equipment being conducted by the RCAF. Air Vice Marshal Curtis undertook to send to General Henry information which would enable the U.S. Army or Naval Air Forces to decide if they wished to participate in further tests at Edmonton. After discussion, the Canadian Section undertook to suggest to the Chiefs of Staff Committee at Ottawa that study be given to the foregoing proposals, including the suggestion that the Army Air Forces participate in the work now being carried on by the RAF and the RCAF at Edmonton. In this connection, both General Spry and Air Vice Marshal Curtis emphasized the need for making early decisions on these suggestions possible in view of the preparations which would be necessary at various Air fields and other installations.

 collaboration, during which views were exchanged informally. It
