Financial Notes.

Canadian bank deposits have during the year been increased at the rate of \$3,000,000 per year, which, in proportion to the population of the Dominion is regarded as a phenomenal rate of increase.

Application will be made to the Dominion House at its present session for an act to incorporate "The Metropolitan Bank of Canada," with the usual powers of banks under the Dominion House act.

In the bill before the Manitoba legislature to incorporate the Winnipeg and Western Trust and Mortgage Co. the name has been changed to the Empire Trust and Mortgage Co. The authorized capital has also increased from \$25,000 to \$35,000.

The Canada Permanent & Western Mortgage Corporation's general statement issued a few days ago, to be presented at the annual meeting on Feb. 23, shows a net profit for the year of \$385,870, or, with the balance of \$100,000 at credit of profit and loss brought forward, amounting to \$485,870. This amount was appropriated as follows: Two half-yearly dividends of \$100,000 each, amounting to \$400,000; and government taxes, \$4,407, leaving a balance of profits to carry forward of \$38,470.

A deputation representing the banks and loan and trust companies of Winnipeg, called on the law amendments committee of the local legislature on Tuesday, and objected to the act incorporating the Royal Trusts Co. on the ground that it was too extensive and greater than those given private companies in the province. Mr. Pettie, behalf of the Royal Trusts, advised that a general clause should be inserted in acts of incorporation forbidding all trust companies from doing a savings bank business, and retaining monies on deposit.

Commercial Men.

S. H. Fergie, of the Hudson Bay Knitting Co., has returned from a trip east, during which he visited his customers at Montreal and Toronto.

W. J. Wilson, western representative of M. Saxe & Co., clothing, Montreal, has returned to his connection with this house, and will hereafter represent S.

Lavinson, Son & Co., in the same branch of trade of Montreal. Mr. Wilson is going east at once to complete arrangements for working the west for his business. He is going back with fall trade samples. He has retained his old sample rooms in the west, and Mr. Lavinson, Son & Co., are practically a new firm as far as the west is concerned, as they have not previously worked for business here.

Manitoba Wheat Stocks.

There were 4,533,398 bushels of wheat in store at Fort William on Feb. 17. The total wheat stocks for the year are 1,707,000 bushels. Stocks in store at Fort William, Port Arthur, Keewatin, Winnipeg, and Interior points are estimated approximately at 15,875,000 bushels, compared with 5,578,000 bushels a year ago. Total wheat stocks for the year are 8,350,000 bushels three years ago, and 5,000,000 bushels four years ago.

Fort William Grain Stocks.

Stocks of grain in store at Fort William on Monday, the 17th inst., were as follows:

Wheat—1 hard, 333,072 bushels; No. 1 northern, 1,878,000 bushels; No. 2 northern, 2,306,837 bushels; No. 3 northern, 90,737 bushels; other grades, 28,483 bushels. Total, the total of which 4,533,398 bushels.

Oats—No. 2, 863,738 bushels. Receipts of wheat at Fort William during the week ending Feb. 17 amounted to 122,800 bushels, and shipments to 1,500 bushels. Receipts of oats amounted to 9,074 bushels, and shipments to 11,800 bushels. Receipts of barley amounted to nil, and shipments nil.

Stocks of wheat in store at Port Arthur on the 10th inst. amounted to 223,418 bushels. Receipts were 31,750 bushels, and shipments nil.

Movements of Business Men.

Wm. Fisher, manager of the Winnipeg branch of The Western Canada and Canada Permanent Mortgage Corporation, left on Tuesday for Toronto where he will consult with the headquarters of this company regarding the year's business. He is expected to be gone about two weeks.

Wm. Whyte, assistant to the C. P. R. president, returned to his office this week. In an interview, Mr. Whyte said he had little to say for publication, save that the probability of the C. P. R. would add 1,600,000 bushels to its fleet elevator at Fort William in addition to the 5,000 bushels elevator of 500,000 bushels capacity, already in operation.

F. W. Thompson, general manager

of the Oryville Milling Company, returned to Winnipeg from an extended trip east last Saturday. He found business good in the east, and says that all eyes are turned towards Manitoba. The enormous work of last year and the grain blockade have devastated this country as it has never been advertised before. Mr. Thompson thinks that the very fact of this country's being so well advertised has proved inadequate. He has benefited in that it demonstrated the necessity for a new mill. He has a total of \$20,000,000 in the C. P. R. for improvement of its facilities, an expenditure which would not otherwise have been made so quickly.

Western Business Items.

Harry Hurton has opened a butcher shop at Carleton, Man. He is found by Dornier & McGilvery, foundrymen, Morden, Man., have dissolved partnership. J. J. Dormer continues the business.

Deliveries of oats are comparatively light at Edmonton, according to the Bulletin. Street prices are 24 to 26¢ at that point.

A. R. Fleming formerly of Brandon, has bought an interest in the hardware business of C. H. Green, Shaw at Hamiota.

Renner & Pete have formed a partnership at Gilbert Plains, and announce their intention of establishing an implement agency.

E. H. Kilgus, grain agent's furnishings, and boots and shoes, Oak River, Man., advertises that he will sell his stock by public auction on Wednesday next.

It is announced that Lord Strathcona will build an immense tenement block in Winnipeg at once, on Main and Broadway. Tenders will shortly be called for the work.

The weather has been very mild this week and what little snow we had has again disappeared in a moment. It was reported yesterday that one farmer at Portage la Prairie had commenced sowing wheat, but this is rather "too previous," we are afraid.

BRITISH LIVESTOCK MARKETS.

London, Feb. 17.—An easier feeling was developed in the market for American cattle since this day week, owing to increased supplies, and prices are 10¢ to 15¢ lower than on Feb. 14. On the other hand, the market for American sheep is stronger and prices show an advance of 10¢ to 15¢, with sales of choice at 12½¢. There was no Canadian stock offered.

For sheep, Feb. 17.—Owing to heavier supply, the trade in cattle was slow, and prices were easier at 12½¢ for choice Canadians. Sheep were firmer and ¼¢ higher at 12¢.

British Columbia Business Review.

Vancouver, Feb. 17. Old eggs are pretty scarce, cleaned out of stock in British Columbia, and it is probable higher prices will prevail. The past few years' speculation in eggs has been very active, and in Vancouver particularly heavy stocks were laid in, in anticipation of a winter advance that did not come. The result was an expression of the street, that commission houses had "eggs to burn." This sort of profligate past experience, there was no heavy stock carried over the market is rare. True, California eggs are arriving, but at such prices that they do not seem to be likely to do much business. British Columbia must then look to Manitoba and the Northwest in the next month for fresh eggs. One promoter's commission house gave it his opinion that California eggs could not be laid out. Another satisfied that the market is that old commission of butter, and is out and commission houses will be able to do a good business in the trade in this line. The local market is healthy. There is little laid in the market that has been long held, and of excellent quality of Canadian laid in the market is bringing quite as good prices for as for United States laid, thus one price is quoted for both brands. There is a much healthier tone throughout in the jobbing business.

There is less opportunity for ruminous competition owing to cheaper grades of goods being sold. The jobbing houses, apparently by tacit consent, have been more anxious for living profits on the goods sold than for the volume of business done, a policy which has been beneficial to the entire trade.

The provincial government's mandate that no cedar logs cut from government lands shall be taken to Puget Sound, is still the subject of much comment in the press. A large number of men are now in the province for government to rescind the law. The shingle mill men seem, however, to have most convincing arguments as to why the law should remain as it is. Certainly as a result of this government measure to keep Canadian cedar for Canadians, shingle business in British Columbia seems to be having the benefit of it. A mill is now erecting a large mill on the Inlet at Vancouver, which he says was to have been erected in Seattle, but for the provincial prohibitive law as regards cedar logs, while the Hastings Shingle company for the same reason is erecting what is claimed to be the largest mill in the world on Burrard Inlet.
