Excepting the case of the great and good Faraday, who, from the stable-room over a London mews to a lecture-desk in the Royal Institution, walked all the way with God, I know of no instance, where simple faith went hand in hand through life with mighty intellect, more striking than that furnished by the Laughing Laddie of Eskdale.
