SAM LEVY COMMITTED

Must Await Trial in Upper Court

Steinfeld's Evidence Implicates Him in Every Deal Made.

At the conclusion of the preliminary hearing before Magistrate Wroughton yesterday evening of Sam Levy, charged with being implicated with Max Steinfield in the robbery of Isaac Bros' warehouse, the prisoner was committed for trial before the territorial court at the next criminal session which sits next month.

Isaac Isaacs testified to keeping two keys of the warehouse in his store, one on a key ring with other keys, and the other in the money drawer.

Francis Corbett, the electrician, also gave evidence regarding his having sold a key to Steinfield and Levy at 11 o'clock at night the latter part of April and of their taking it away and returning in half an hour with complaint that it did not fit and of him telling them to smoke the key, then try it in the lock and file down the places shown by marks in the black on the key.

Several other witnesses were examined, considerable of the testimony having no bearing on the charge against Levy.

FOUND DEAD IN CABIN
