NO RESERVATIONS WILL BE ALLOWED ROUMANIA

Allies Tell Rumania She Must Sign Peace Treaty Without Any Reservation or Not at All.

Paris, Sept. 8.—The Supreme Council of the Peace Conference today informed Rumania that she must sign the peace treaty with Austria without reservations or abstain altogether from signing. The Rumanian peace delegation has not yet reached a decision on the matter.

The Rumanian delegation on Saturday sent a note to the Peace Conference declaring that its intention was to sign the Austrian treaty with reservations. The Supreme Council this morning took the Rumanian note under consideration, the result being the decision that there must be no reservations.

Capt. H. W. R. Moore, returning officer, has appointed Capt. Carow Martin, M. C., as registrar of voters in Victoria for the bye-election to be held October 27. Thirty-eight deputy registrars will be appointed within the next few days.
