A lumber pile made of boards, each 100 feet long and 6 feet in width, would be an unprecedented sight in the east, but a gentleman recently returned from a visit to the coast of the North Pacific ocean says that piles of timber such as that are common at the mills' on Puget sound. "Boards 100 feet long and 6 feet wide, without a knot in them," he says, "are common cuts from the grantic fit trees of the Puget sound." The timber bet covers 30,000,000 acres of Washington Territory, an area equal to the states of Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut and New Hampshire. 
