King Edward is A hard Worker.

Finds it Difficult to Accomplish All He Has to do in Twelve Hours Day.

King Edward in the course of an audience granted last week to the leaders of the church army movement in England, who are endeavoring to deal with the difficult problems created by the needs of laboring men who are unemployed, and therefore, in want, incidentally mentioned that he was obliged to work very hard himself and that his ordinary working day was one of not eight, but 12 hours, and that he considered himself fortunate when he accomplished all he had to do in that time.

This pronouncement caused to the American newspapers, has excited a considerable amount of amazement among those there who have been accustomed to look upon the British monarch as essentially a man of pleasure, indeed as one of the greatest sybarites in Europe and the question has arisen as to what the labors of the British monarch really are.

It may therefore be as well to explain that the King has hundreds of documents to sign every day of the year, Sundays included. It must be borne in mind that as a general principle no administrative act by the Government and no act of Parliament is valid in the eyes of the law until it receives the sign manual of the sovereign. Everything done by the Government of the day in the name of the nation, is a sovereign act, no matter how trivial it may be, and a sovereign act cannot be complete and therefore valid until it

HAS RECEIVED THE SOVEREIGN'S SIGNATURE.

Fifteen years ago it was estimated by competent authorities that the number of documents receiving the signature of Queen Victoria averaged at least 60,000 per annum. That would give about 200 for each week day throughout the entire 12 months. Since that time documents requiring the sign manual of the British sovereign have enormously increased, and it is probable that today the papers which King Edward is obliged to sign average between four and five hundred a day. Let my readers imagine what this means, especially when it is borne that the royal or imperial sanction cannot be lightly given, and that King Edward, for the German Kaiser, nor the rulers of Austria, Italy and Denmark will affix their names to any documents without having fully mastered its contents.

During the early part of the reign of Queen Victoria, she was accustomed to rely entirely upon the discretion and judgment of ministers and to sign without reading the papers submitted to her for signature by her constitutional advisers. But one day she was dismayed to find that she had given her royal sanction to a measure of which she most strongly disapproved and which she knew to be wrong. From that time forth she made a point of never signing any paper until she has satisfied herself as to its purpose and probable consequence.

The commission of every officer of the army and navy and the diplomatic corps from admirals of the fleet, field marshals and ambassadors, down to the most youthful subaltern or beardless attaché, requires the signature of the King, whose approval is likewise necessary to the draft of every important despatch sent out by the Department of Foreign Affairs. All the more important appointments, administrative as well as judicial, must have the sovereign's written consent. No one can relieve the sovereign of this particular portion of his work. Any cessation of it would throw out of gear the entire administrative machinery of the empire. In the first few days that followed the demise of Queen Victoria, King Edward was occupied literally day and night in reading, and signing the thousands of documents of one kind and another that had accumulated during the few days of

BRIEF ILLNESS. The giving of these signatures, arduous as in the work entailed when a monarch is conscientious, constitutes but a part of the day's business. The German and Austri-

an rulers require their Cabinet Ministers to make at least twice a week verbal reports of all important matters concerning their department, in addition to their written communications. Queen Victoria insisted upon this only in the case of the foreign office, but King Edward demands that he should be kept informed about all matters of moment, and he is constantly calling upon this Minister or that Government official to furnish him with special reports.

Not a day passes without several Government functionaries being received in audience, and the interview is usually followed by some action on the part of the sovereign or the dignity in question. Then there are interviews to be granted to foreign envoys, to persons connected with the administration of the household as well as to men eminent in art, literature and science. It must be borne in mind that each of these audiences means the discussion of important business, for people are not in the habit of seeking interviews with rulers of nations in order to in ulge in mere small talk, immunity from which, indeed, is one of the few advantages enjoyed nowadays by monarchs.

Throughout the entire day and oftentimes far into the night there is a constant succession of messages arriving for the sovereign. In London as also in Berlin and Vienna, the minister of foreign affairs is under orders of transmit to the monarch immediately on its arrival a copy of every despatch that arrives from abroad either by telegraph or by mail, and the reading and discussion of these dispatches alone constitutes a tax upon royal time and energy.




