ALLIES SHOWING LUMBER TRADE CONFIDENCE IN GOOD WILL OF GERMANY

Important Correspondence issued by British Foreign Office Embodies Substance of Recent Decisions of Ambassadors' Conference.

REDUCE OCCUPYING FORCES

Rhineland Commission Has a Far-Reaching Plan of . Re. form Under Consideration Having a Two-fold Purpose.

London, Nov.. 17-Important cor-

espondence issued by the Foreign Office tonight embodying the subance of recent decisions of the Ampassador's conference with German shows that it has not only been decid d to complete the evacuation of Cologne, or the first zone, by Febreduce the occupying forces in the second and third zones to conforn German garrisons, to vacate the land nd buildings and abolish many wa ion of the German courts, except in cases of a pronounced military nature Allies in thus showing confidence in the goodwill of the German government and people are anticipating reciprocation of such confidence and goodwill. The principal documents are two notes signed by M. Briand, the French foreign minister, in behalf of the conference, dated November 14. and November 16. The former states that the conclusion of th Locarno agreements testifies to the desire animating the governments to introduce into their relations a spirit of goodwill and confidence..


