You can PHONE 70 War News Messages Received Previous to BRITISH PASSENGER SUBMERGED.

LONDON, March 29.—A report yesterday, that the steamer Falaba had been sunk by a German submarine, was confirmed today. She was sent to the bottom yesterday afternoon off Milford Haven on the coast of South Wales. Loss of life is probably heavy. Falaba was considerably in most of the British ships which have been sunk by the submarines. She belonged to the Elder Line and was owned by the same company. She was on her way to the West Coast of Africa with 140 passengers and crew. Her officers stated that when the submarine appeared in three times as a signal for her to prepare lifeboats, but this could be done the torpedo hit the ship near the engine-room lifeboats were swamped and persons aboard the vessel thrown into the sea, where they died, while the submarine about her. A fishing boat appeared on and saved 140 of the passengers. Capt. Davis was dead, and eight other bodies covered. The survivors were taken to Milford Haven. The submarine was 70 miles southwest of Milford Haven submarine appeared. She was the captain of the Falaba to but he ignored the order, and started at full speed, and the liner was a fast craft, and the hour the chase was kept up submarine overhauled her, and crew were given five minutes to leave, and although this was very brief, most of the passengers were saved. The submarine struck the Falaba in the bow and a terrific explosion followed, ship settled down and sank quickly. Some of the lifeboats smashed, and scores of passengers struggling in the water when they appeared on the scene.
