IRISH AGREEMENT REACHED. DETAILS NOT WORKED OUT.

Parliament Refuses to Co-operate with French.—Republican Outrages Continue in Ireland.—Atlantic Storms Disastrous to Shipping

ELIGHTENING OUT DETAILS. SYDNEY, Feb. 17. The conference between the operators and striking men with the committee of mediators was still closed at three o'clock this morning. It was expected that an agreement had been reached but trouble details delayed completion.

MORE TALES FROM THE SEA. NEW YORK, Feb. 16. The daring of crews of ships seeking to aid sinking and distressed vessels was reported in wireless messages to-day as ice coated trans-Atlantic boats brought to port the story of severe storms and sufferings. Four craft searched mountainous seas five hundred miles off the Virginia Capes for the Italian freighter Moncenzio, reported sinking yesterday, with a crew of thirty-six, but reported at dusk they had found no trace. The luckless British auxiliary schooner Dorin which has figured in the news of marine disasters since last November was abandoned off the New Jersey Coast and her crew rescued by the Lamport and Holt steamer Vassar. Coastguard cutters continue to search for the two masted schooner reported adrift off Fire Island yesterday morning without avail. The steamer Araguaya, from Bermuda, with bridge wrecked and forward deck

TANKS IN ESSEN.

Two French soldiers were wounded here last night by German security police, who interfered in a cafe altercation. Tension, which was already high, has been increased, and to-day the French moved tanks into the city.

GERMAN RAIL WORKER SHOT.

Several cases of sabotage were reported during the night and in one instance resulted in the death of a German rail worker who disregarded orders against entering a roundhouse and was shot by a sentry.

LAW REFUSES.

Premier Boar Law at the Conference with the French which ended this afternoon, is reported to have refused transportation of facilities for occupational forces through the British zone at Cologne, but is said to have offered to transfer a small portion of the zone to complete French control.

SARCOPHAGUS FOUND.

The sarcophagus of King Tutankhamen was found when the inner chamber of the tomb was opened to-day. Many articles of furniture were seen in the mortuary chamber, but the official inspection will be delayed until Sunday when it will be made a public function with distinguished guests.

JUST AFLOAT.

The schooner Friendship, lumber laden, out of Norfolk for a New England port, was found by the coast-guard cutter Manning at noon to-day barely afloat in heavy seas, but the Manning reported that seven men of her crew could be rescued.

Police Make Raid.

One day last week acting on a report that a small drop was being vend- ed at a store on New Gower Street, the police raided the premises and located a bottle of "medicine" hidden under the counter. Following the seizure a medical man became mixed up in the affair and as a result both physician and his patient will likely appear in court next week on a charge of violating the Prohibition Act.
