

Gruesome Find in Bag in Pond.

Crisfield, Md., April 21 .- (Associated Press)—An investigation to solve the mystery which surrounds the casting of a bag containing the headless bodies of two negro children and three severed heads into a pond here was begun yesterday afternoon.
