DRIED FISH.

Exporters of dried fish in this prov ince are anxiously waiting for one thing, and that is the cleaning up of in the West India markets. As a matter of fact, to-day, some of the West India markets are so glutted with con signments of Newfoundland fish, that it is bound to take some time to clear them up. Porto Rico is one of these markets, and the situation there is reported to be worse now than it has been at any time in the past two years. But the longest day must have an ending, and so, sooner or later, there will be an ending of the carried-over stock of Newfoundland. In the meantime there is not much for local exporters to do but mark time and thank fortune that they have no old fish to sell. We have not heard of any recent purchases of new bank Lunenburg fish; in our last report we said that a few had been made at \$6.00. which is of course too high a figure to show any profit on shipments today. However, with the last Newfoundland old stock out of the way. there will come a more active demand for new fish, and perhaps it may be that prices will be sufficiently high in the West Indies to assure a small mar-

So far as other foreign markets are concerned, they are all very dead, and the competition for business is exceedingly keen. Norway has been offering fish in Brazil at a price equal to about \$5.50 per quintal Halifax.
