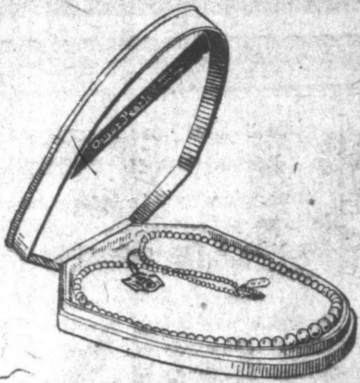

**Better Ship May be Put in Cabot Strait Service**

NORTH SYDNEY, Dec. 19.—Premier Warren, of Newfoundland, has returned home after three months absence during which he attended the Imperial Conference in London, England. The Premier was accompanied from North Sydney by Mrs. Warren, R. G. Reid, of the Reid Newfoundland Company, and Mrs. Reid, and M. S. Sullivan, member of the Newfoundland Legislature for Placentia and St. Mary's, all of whom are returning from Britain. During his short stay in North Sydney Premier Warren discussed local issues and developments in the political situation with his friends, but declined to make any statement regarding a number of other problems which he pleaded, he must first lay before his council at St. John's.

The Premier believes that the greatest problem with which his Dominion had to deal at the present time is the unemployment situation, and he expressed the hope that a number of promised developments would assist this situation materially, if not relieve it entirely.

Premier Warren is carrying back to Newfoundland a proposition made by President Wolvin of the British Empire Steel Corporation, relative to the Bell Island iron ore mines, where operations have been seriously curtailed by the corporation. Whether the offer was a favorable one or not Premier Warren would not intimate.

Premier Warren said he had, while in England, interviewed representatives of iron and steel companies, and others, in an endeavor to find a market for the Bell Island product, but did not receive very bright encouragement. It was intimated by one of the members of the Premier's party that Sir Newton Moore, one of the directors of the British Empire Steel Corporation in England, was following up this lead by endeavoring to sell Bell Island ore to British, German and other steel making firms. The general tone of the conversation did not reflect opinion of a very bright quality.

Regarding other matters Premier Warren was more optimistic. He said the general feeling in Britain toward Newfoundland is very friendly, and the Dominion stood with a good reputation in financial circles.

**Blames British Industry FOR CURTAILED PRODUCTION.**

LONDON, Dec. 7.—(A.P.)—Sir Herbert Hambling, president of the Bankers Institute, blames capital and labor for restricted industrial output in England more than he does the economic crisis in Europe.

"I say without hesitation," Sir Herbert declared in a recent address, "that although we are losing much trade because of the European situation, a situation largely outside our control, we are losing more as a result of our high production costs, a situation within our control."

"I contend that if all restriction on output were removed by labor, and if all our trading interests aimed at making a large total profit by securing a small profit on each individual item of a big output, rather than by making a large profit on a small output, we should increase our overseas trade, develop our home markets and provide a large number of our unemployed with remunerative work."
