ROME, Dec. 10-(U.P.) - Vatican circles to-day manifested their undisguised displeasure at the publicity given the recent letter of the United Committee for Prohibition Enforcement. (U.S.A.), appealing for Papal moral support for the organization's work. The fact that the letter was made public in Washington before it was in the hands of His Holiness was disliked, especially as such appeals are deemed confidential until the proper time for public announcement

As a result of the Vatican's displeasure, it is now practically certain that the letter will be answered, while courteously, only with a simple acknowledgement of receipt.

OTTAWA, Dec. 10 - (C.P.) - The Turkish bath has nothing on the methods used by the Thompson River and Carrier Indians of the Plateau Region in British Columbia, as told to a large audience by Harlan I. Smith, Dominion Archaeologist, in the Victoria Museum last night. When a member of either of these

ribes is in need of a Turkish or "Sweat" bath, he first builds a fire, and then rolls boulders into it. When these boulders are heated they are rolled into a house built of timber and earth, and the person taking the bath lies on a couch, in the nude. The hot boulders are then sprinkled with vater, and steam is created, causing he bather to perspire violently. The next move is a dash through the door of the house, and a plunge into the river. The bather then emerges, "feeling like a two-year-old."


