

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

(BY ATLANTIC CABLE) London, Sep. 18th.—Hon. Sir John Young, present Governor-General of New South Wales, and ex-Ionian Commissioner, has been named for Governor-General of Canada.

Florence, Sept. 18th.—The Nations of this city says that Prime Minister Monbrea has not asked the French Government for the withdrawal of the troops from Rome as has been reported.

Cardinal Reissach has been tried by a civil court at Rieti, and sentenced to pay a fine of 500 francs, for attempting to take possession of the See of Sabina by order of the Pope without the authorization of the King of Italy.

Biarritz, Sept. 18th.—The Emperor Napoleon, the Empress and the Prince Imperial, to-day made a visit to Queen Isabella of Spain at St. Sebastian.

Metz, Sept. 18th.—A terrible explosion took place at a cartridge factory in this city to-day; thirty persons were killed outright, and eighty-two were badly wounded; the building in which the explosion occurred was torn to pieces.

Moscow, as well as St. Petersburg, is in great danger of conflagration from the fires in the woods.
