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Rebellion Spreading

The Situation in India Is Growing Worse.
And the Government Must Face a Grave Crisis.
The Fall of Fort Ali-Musjid a Serious Blow.
Wild Excitement Among the Hindoo Traders on the Kurram River—The Amser of Afghanistan Attacks His Loyalty to the British Government.

Bombay, Aug. 25—11 p.m.—The latest dispatches received from the front indicate that the situation on the frontier is getting worse. It is evident that the Indian government must face a grave crisis, involving heavy expenditures, and probably great loss of life. The government is confronted with the following state of affairs: Khyber Pass has fallen into the hands of the Afghans, the posts in the Kurram Valley are threatened by the powerful tribe of the Orakzais; the Mohmand tribesmen are meditating a renewal of hostilities around Fort Shahkard, while thousands of troops are engaged in crushing the revolt in the valley and the large brigades are threatening the Tachi Valley. The Mahsudis are again restless. The amser of Afghanistan is threatening the British position at Fort Ali-Musjid could only have fallen.

After Desperate Fighting, as the native garrison of Khyber Rifles, grand fighting, was made up of men who rendered valuable assistance in the Black Mountain expedition in 1888. The fall of the fort is a very serious blow, for it isolates Fort Lunda-Kolai, which is at the extreme end of Khyber Pass, garrisoned by 300 rifles, and necessitates the prompt reconquest of the pass.

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
