LATEST MARKETS

LOCAL MARKET.

London, November 12.

The attendance at the market today surpassed even last Saturday, and was the largest so far this season. Sales were brisk for nearly every line except wheat, apples and pears; the market was over-supplied with these articles. Prices held up well and could be considered amply to firm.

Grain—Oats sold well. About 25 loads were offered. Sales were made at 82 to 84 per cent. Wheat is steady at \$1 per bushel. Barley, 90 to 92 per cent. Buckwheat, 81 to 82 per cent.

Butter and Eggs—Butter was in good demand; the supply was moderately large; sales were made at 17c to 18c for crock and 19c to 20c for pound rolls. Eggs firm at 22c to 23c per dozen, whole, and smaller lots 24c to 25c per dozen.

Vegetables and Roots—Potatoes were not so plentiful as on last Saturday. About half the quantity was offered; prices firm; most of the sales made at 70c to 75c for the best. Cabbages sold well at 30c to 35c per dozen. Celery plentiful at 20c to 25c per dozen. Onions, 90c to \$1 per bushel or \$1.40 to \$1.50 per bag. Beets, 40c per bushel. Turnips, 25c to 30c per bag.

Fruits—Apples were very dull of sale; real choice apples, which could be considered extra good, were offered at 40c per bag, and there were dull sales at the lower figure, which were made at 30c to 35c for bobbles and 30c to 35c for nice ones; pears, 20c to 25c per bushel. Grapes, 20c to 25c per bushel. Chestnuts, 20c to 25c per bushel.

Poultry—The supply in this line was large; the near approach of Thanksgiving no doubt caused the big delivery; sales were made at the lower figure, which were made at 10c to 12c for broilers and 12c to 14c for nice ones; geese, 20c to 25c per bushel. Ducks, 20c to 25c per bushel. Chickens, 45c to 50c per pair, alive, and 50c to 55c per pair, dressed. Hens, 40c to 45c per pair, alive, and 45c to 50c per pair, dressed. Most of the fowls were dressed, mostly at 45c.

Dressed Hogs—About 80 were offered today; sales fairly brisk at 75 to 77 per cent, mostly at the lower figure, which were made at 10c to 12c for broilers and 12c to 14c for nice ones; pears, 20c to 25c per bushel. Grapes, 20c to 25c per bushel. Chestnuts, 20c to 25c per bushel.

Butchers' Meats—Sales were slow in this line; the supply was large and the following prices prevailed: Beef, 10c to 11c for corn beef, and 10c to 11c for hangers and steaks; veal, 8c to 9c per lb. Pork, 6c to 7c per lb. for hindquarters and 5c for fore-quarters.

STOCK MARKETS.

H. C. Becker, stock broker, Bank of Commerce building, received the following by private wire from Bartlett, Frazier & Carrington today:

New York, Nov. 12.—Noon.—The bank statement is much more favorable than was anticipated, loans and deposits showing no heavy reduction as to nearly counterbalance the loss in cash. This is likely to result in a continuance and widening of the prevailing speculation, as it will give confidence to operators for a rise. There seems no doubt the public interest is increasing, but as yet the large traders are the principal holders of stocks, and they naturally will make every effort to hold prices at the present level until they can distribute them. As far as stock prices are concerned it was on the whole strong, in spite of somewhat heavy profit-taking in some quarters. Manipulation of the industrial was evident, especially in Missouri, Pacific, Corn Products, Distillers, and Con. Tobacco, preferred. The market closed with an optimistic feeling prevailing. Expectation that next week will witness an active and rising market.
